



## HAZARDOUS MATERIAL SHIPMENTS

Shipment of Hazardous Materials (Dangerous Goods) is highly regulated. The Office of Environmental Health and Safety (EHS) is available to assist faculty, staff, and students who make hazardous material shipments. EHS can provide training, guidance and support services that will help ensure hazardous material shipments arrive at their destination in the safest way possible.

<sup>1</sup> All radioactive or chemical shipments MUST be shipped by EHS personnel. As a service, EHS will pick up the material to be shipped, at which point a PTAO will be provided to EHS by the lab to pay for shipping (charges will be recovered from the lab of origin via cost transfer). The material will then be taken back to the EHS office, where it will be properly packaged, marked, labeled and documented for shipment.

<sup>2</sup> Shipments of Infectious Substances (including those on dry ice) will continue to be the responsibility of the certified shipper and personnel must complete training every 2 years. See <https://vprgsecure.web.virginia.edu/bio/training.cfm> for more information.
